







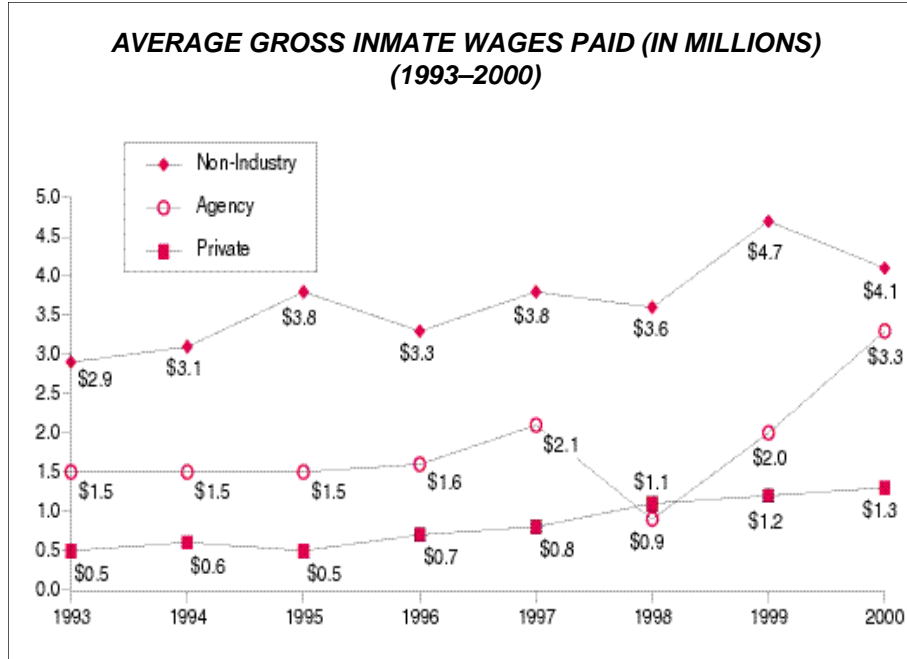

Snapshot: Correctional Industry Wages Paid To Inmates in 2000

-  **Gross:** The total amount inmates earned by working in various industries programs. Wages are generally based on a hourly or daily wage and the amount of time worked. (For more on inmate wages, see pages 130–131)
-  **Net:** The amount of money inmates actually received for their work. Inmates wages are sometimes garnished for victim restitution, child support, cost-of-incarceration fees, etc.
-  Inmates in agency-operated industries earned \$144.1million during FY '00 in 44 agencies. In 28 agencies, inmates were paid \$84.6 million. On average, in the 27 agencies reporting both wages earned and paid, inmates were paid \$0.97 for every dollar they earned.
-  Twenty-two agencies reported inmates earned \$28.6 million working in privately-operated industries. In twenty agencies, inmates were paid \$16.2 million. On average, in the 19 agencies reporting both wages earned and paid, inmates working in private industries were paid \$0.57 for every dollar they earned.
-  Inmates in twenty-four agencies earned \$98.5 million during FY'00 working in non-industry jobs. In 18 agencies, inmates were paid \$65.7 million. In the 17 agencies reporting both wages earned and paid, inmates were paid an average of \$0.91 for every dollar earned.
-  Inmates in Massachusetts received the highest net wages (\$59,524,335) among agency-operated industries. The highest net wages in the private industry (\$2,700,00) were in Iowa, while New York's inmates received the highest net wages (\$16,118,314) in non-industry jobs.
